1. **The meeting was called to order by Chairman Morthorst at 7:00 p.m.**
2. **Physically Present: DeLacluyse, Janik, Morthorst, Rieth and Rohrer (7:15 p.m.).

5. **Discussion**

**A. Druce Lake Dredging**

**Commissioner Rieth questioned what the Village would be dredging (what is the composition of the muck) and what was the outcome of the meeting the Village engineer was suppose to have with Stormwater Management regarding grant money to help with Druce Lake. She also reported that her neighbor said that the weeds and lily pads are turning yellow. He wanted to know if there was a problem with the health of the Lake.**

**Commissioner Janik said he is concerned about dredging on private vs Village property. He questioned how much dredging beyond the private property would the Village have to do and what results would be attained (would it all fill back in).**

**Chairman Morthorst stated that the muck needs to be analyzed and the Village needs to check into a place to dump it (landfill, farmer's field or Forest Preserve).**

**Commissioner Rohrer questioned how much of a nuisance the muck is and how many residents it affects.**

**Chairman Morthorst said the maybe 20-25 residents are affected. He also said that that the Commission needs to "brain storm" on this, come up with options no matter how crazy because the Village will be spending approximately \$500,000. He also said that this project won't happen this year.**

**Commissioner Janik suggested doing one or two properties as a trial.**

**Consensus of the Commission was to recommend to the Board of Trustees that a boring of the muck area be conducted and the results transmitted to the Lakes Commission for review and advice.**

**B. "No Wake" flag**

**The Village Clerk reported that during this past storm the water level was very high. She said that Trustee Kowalke checked the Dam and found the water was flowing over the Dam itself and he noted that resident's pier were under water. He put up the red flag for "No Wake" at the Village Boat Launch. She also reported that Mariner's cove resident Jill Rohrer put a sign on the Mariner's Cove boat launch that indicated a "No Wake" condition on the lake.**

**The Village Clerk also reported that there has been discussion regarding the Village and the Mariner's Cove Homeowners Association putting a red flag for "No Wake" at the Mariner's Cove boat launch.**

**Consensus of the Commissioners was to support the red flag at the Mariner's Cove boat launch.**

**C. Swimmer's Itch**

**Commissioner DeLacluyse stated that his family swims in front of their house and they weren't aware that the Druce Lake beach was closed because of swimmer's itch. He asked whether the homeowners association could notify the residents.**

**Other Commissioners suggested that flag be put up, a sign at the entrance of Mariner's Cove or a flyer be put in the resident's mail boxes.**

**Consensus of the Commission is that a flag is needed at the Druce Lake beach when there is a health issue and that the flag/sign will indicate the beach is "closed". This issue should be addressed by the Mariner's Cove Homeowners Association.**

**C. Storm Damage Cost**

**Chairman Morthorst asked the Commissioners to give the issue of shoreline vesting some thought and that the issue be put on the agenda for discussion.**


