

3. Chairman Morthorst said that he was going to have Commissioner Rohrer work on the lake clean up for next spring (April). He will talk to him.

4. Chairman Morthorst asked Commissioner DeLacluyse to take his project issue and combine it with number 2 from Chairman Morthorst list. He said that he would like Commissioner DeLacluyse to combine the two into communication.

5. Chairman Morthorst said that he would take the last one on his list "Monitor the Lake".

6. Chairman Morthorst asked that Commissioner Williams take number 1 on his list, "Limit all motor craft motors to not older than xxxxx years. Commissioner Williams said he would take it.

2. Village Clerk Beggan was asked to call Mike Adams and ask him to come to the next Lakes Meeting and explain the 2008 Lakes report to the Commissioners.

3. Commissioner Williams stated that he has a few items that his neighbors' have given him:

- Have the Village ban inboard motors because the wake boards they pull are creating very high waves.
- Follow the State law regarding the age requirement of those driving the boats, personal watercraft etc.
- Personal water craft are coming very close to other crafts.

Chairman Morthorst stated that when someone sees a violation of a Village Ordinance or a State Law they should call the Village Hall. He said that in order for the Village Hall to do anything about the complaint they have to have as much information as possible.

4. Village Clerk Beggan told the Commission that the President had asked her to inform the Commission that there was an aerator line cut this past weekend. He wanted to know what the Commissioner thought about assessing those boaters who have power boats \$10.00, so that the Village can repair the lines that are cut.

Commissioner DeLacluyse suggested putting colored buoys along the aerator line so that people can stay away from the lines.

Commissioner Janik suggested putting a “No Anchoring” buoy on the aerator.

Chairman Morthorst suggested that the Village put a stainless steel sleeve on the pipe to protect it. He said he would like to talk to President Beggan and get his thoughts.

5. Reports on the Lakes

Commissioner Rieth said the weeds are reduced in Druce Lake and the water is low.

Commissioner Janik reported that Mariner’s Cove Boat Launch rocks have been moved from 12” to 24”. He explained that the corner of the cement slab, that is the launch, cracked last summer and the Homeowners Association had a load of rocks put in the launch area to help boaters with getting their boats off their trailers. The rocks don’t help and the boat launch needs to be repaired.

Commissioner DeLachyse said that he attended the Mariner’s Cove Homeowners Association (MCHOA) this month and said that the MCHOA listened to residents suggest putting sandbags under the ramp and talk to the man who put the ramp in the last time. He said that the ponds need to be repaired because of the erosion and they will probably have to have an assessment of \$300 to do all the work.

Commissioner Williams suggested “mud jacking”.
