The following items have been approved by the Village Board:

✍ Accounts Payable dated May 16, 2016 totaling \$33,351.13.

✍ Approval of Ordinance No. 16-05-01 An Ordinance Appropriating for all Corporate Purposes for the Village of Third Lake, Lake County Illinois, for the Fiscal Year Beginning May 1, 2016 and Ending April 30, 2017.

✍ Approval of Ordinance No. 16-05-02, An Ordinance Providing for the Levy of Taxes for the Fiscal Year Commencing on May 1, 2016 and Ending April 30, 2017 of the Village of Third Lake, Lake County, Illinois.

Remember the Repellent When You Go Out

Warmer weather means spending more time outdoors. But, it also means that mosquitoes are becoming active. The Lake County Health Department/Community Health Center is encouraging residents to be vigilant about eliminating sources for mosquitoes to breed as well as using protection to avoid mosquito bites.

Recommendations to prevent mosquito breeding include:

- Discard old tires, buckets, drums or any water holding containers; poke holes in tires used as bumpers on docks
- Keep roof gutters and downspouts clear of debris
- Empty plastic wading pools at least once a week and store indoors when not in use
- Drain unused swimming pools
- Fill in tree rot holes and hollow stumps that hold water
- Change the water in bird baths and plant urns at least once a week
- Store boats upside down or drain rainwater weekly

Recommendations to prevent mosquito bites include:

- Wear light-colored clothing that minimizes exposed skin and provides some protection from mosquito bites
- Make sure door and window screens fit tightly and that all holes are repaired
- Apply insect repellent that includes DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus or IR 3535 according to label instructions; consult a physician before using repellents on infants

County residents may report areas of stagnant water (conducive for mosquito breeding) as well as locations of dead birds, or learn more about the signs and symptoms of West Nile encephalitis by calling the West Nile hotline number: (847) 377-8300.

**WATERCRAFT STICKERS/
REGISTRATION**

Get your boat stickers and keys starting April 1st. Every watercraft must have **both** a state registration sticker and a Village sticker. In order to purchase a Village sticker, **you must have a valid current state registration on file with the Village.** If you purchase a new boat, a processed application for state registration from the DNR will be accepted for this year. The Village has past years' registrations on file. If you are unsure of your status, please call the Village Hall. Boat stickers will not be issued without one of these documents. Village boat launch (in Sunshine Subdivision) keys may also be purchased at the Village Hall or through the mail. To order by mail, send a check payable to the Village of Third Lake for the appropriate amount, a copy of current state registration, and a list of your watercraft by type and state registration numbers. For your convenience, there is an application form on our website, www.thirdlakevillage.com. Or, visit the Village Hall during office hours. For Mariner's Cove boat launch keys contact the Mariner's Cove Home Owner's Association.

ILLINOIS BOATING ORDINANCE

There have been important changes to the boating regulations in Illinois and the Village of Third Lake. The Illinois boat registration and safety act can be viewed at the following website:

The Village of Third Lake registration and boating rules and regulations ordinance can be picked up at the Village Hall or a PDF copy can be emailed to you if you would like. One of the major changes to the ordinance is that the operator of any watercraft that is towing a person or persons shall display a bright orange flag measuring not less than 12 inches per side. The flag shall be displayed at the highest point of the area surrounding the boats helm as to be visible from all directions, continuously, while the person or persons being towed depart the boat in preparation for towing and until re-entry into the boat when the activity has ceased. Display of the flag for purposes other than the activity described is prohibited.

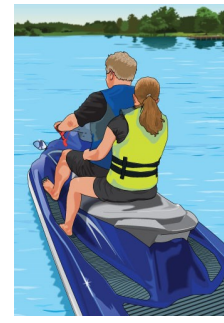

It's the Law!

All Persons born after January 1, 1998 are required by Illinois State Law to take and pass a boating safety course validated by the Illinois Department of Natural Resources and hold a valid boating safety certificate before they can operate a motorboat with an engine over 10 Horsepower. **THIS INCLUDES PERSONAL WATER CRAFT!**

≈ Persons at least 12 years of age and less than 18 years of age may operate a motorboat with over 10 horsepower only if they are accompanied on the motorboat and under the direct control of a parent or guardian or a person at least 18 years of age designated by a parent or guardian, or the motorboat operator is in possession of a Boating Safety Certificate issued by the Department of Natural Resources, Division of Law enforcement, authorizing the holder to operate motorboats.

When picking up your Village boat stickers this year, you will be given a copy of the new Boating Ordinance, Rules and Guidelines. **Please share these important documents with your children and visitors as well.**

REMINDERS

- ★ **Inoperable Vehicles** - It is a violation of the Village Ordinance to park or store a vehicle which is inoperable or unlicensed in residential driveways.
- ★ **Clear Paths** - As a courtesy to Village residents and guests, property owners are required to trim trees and shrubs that extend into the sidewalks and streets. People should be able to walk on the sidewalks without bumping into them.
- ★ **Building Permits** - If you are unsure whether or not your project requires a building permit, please call the Village Hall for confirmation. Some projects that you may not know require permits include:
 - Hot water heater replacement
 - Air conditioning unit replacement
 - Furnace replacement
 - Interior remodeling
- ★ **Overnight Parking** - There is no parking on Village streets between the hours of 2:00 am and 7:00 am. If you need to leave a car on the street overnight, you must call or email the Village Hall by 2:00 am. Leave a message including your name, address & the vehicle (s) license plate number (s). ***** PLEASE DO NOT FORGET TO LEAVE THE LICENSE PLATE NUMBER (S)*****
- ★ **Pets and Pet Waste** - Pets are not permitted to roam the Village freely. All pets are required to be leashed when not on the owner's property. Allowing your dog to deposit waste on another resident's property or on Village sidewalks or streets and not picking up the waste is a violation of our Village Ordinance.
- ★ **Burning** - Dry leaves, brush, branches under 1 1/2" in diameter, and yard waste may be burned between **April 15 and May 15.**
