TREE TRIMMING

During the months of June, July and August, ComEd will begin performing regularly scheduled vegetation management activities within the Village. ComEd's vegetation management activities are necessary to ensure the reliability of electrical service and to ensure public safety. Qualified line clearance workers contracted by ComEd perform all tree pruning and vegetation management work. Supervisors and general foreman maintain close contact with crews to ensure safety and adherence to proper vegetation maintenance procedures.

VILLAGE TREE PRESERVATION ORDINANCE

It is the stated public policy of the Village of Third Lake to preserve and protect, to the greatest extent possible, existing trees within the Village as an important public resource. In addition to adding to the scenic beauty of the Village, the maintenance of trees and wooded areas tends to preserve the ecology of the Village through the filtering effect of trees on air pollutants. Trees also help to provide a noise barrier, help to prevent erosion of topsoil, provide nesting areas for birds and other wildlife, provide windbreaks and shaded areas, and increase property values by adding to the aesthetic quality of the land.

A protected tree means any tree 8 inches or larger in diameter measured fifty-four inches above the existing grade.

If a protected tree is removed, the property owner shall replace each tree so removed within one year so as to minimize the visual impact from the loss of each tree as observed from adjacent properties or parkways.

A permit is required to remove any protected tree.

Conditions under which a permit may be issued:

- The tree is dead or dying
- The tree is diseased
- The tree is damaged or injured to the extent that it is likely to die or become diseased
- The removal of the tree will enhance the Tree Preservation Area and the health of the remaining trees.
- The removal of the tree will avoid or alleviate an economic hardship or a hardship of another nature on the property or residence
- The tree is a public hazard
- The removal of the tree is consistent with good forestry practices

REMINDERS

- ★ **Inoperable Vehicles** - It is a violation of the Village Ordinance to park or store a vehicle which is inoperable or unlicensed in residential driveways.
- ★ **Clear Paths** - As a courtesy to Village residents and guests, property owners are required to trim trees and shrubs that extend into the sidewalks and streets. People should be able to walk on the sidewalks without bumping into them.
- ★ **Building Permits** - If you are unsure whether or not your project requires a building permit, please call the Village Hall for confirmation.

Some projects that you may not know need permits include:

- Hot water heater replacement
- Air conditioning unit replacement
- Furnace replacement
- Interior remodeling
- ★ **Overnight Parking** - There is no parking on Village streets between the hours of 2:00 am and 7:00 am. If you need to leave a car on the street overnight, you must call or email the Village Hall by 2:00 am. Leave a message including your name, address & the vehicle (s) license plate number (s). ***** PLEASE DO NOT FORGET TO LEAVE THE LICENSE PLATE NUMBER (S)*****

- ★ **Pets and Pet Waste** - Pets are not permitted to roam the Village freely. All pets are required to be leashed when not on the owner's property. Allowing your dog to deposit waste on another resident's property or on Village sidewalks or streets and not picking up the waste is a violation of our Village Ordinance.



- ★ **Burning** - Dry leaves, brush, branches under 1 1/2" in diameter, and yard waste may be burned between November 1 and November 30.
- ★ All waste materials must be placed out at the curb for collection by 6:00am the day of your collection, but not before 5:00pm the day before your pick-up. **This includes yard waste bags and containers.**

WATERCRAFT STICKERS/REGISTRATION

Get your boat stickers and keys starting April 1st. Every watercraft must have **both** a state registration sticker and a Village sticker. In order to purchase a Village sticker, **you must have a valid current state registration on file with the Village.** If you purchase a new boat, a processed application for state registration from the DNR will be accepted for this year. The Village has past years' registrations on file. If you are unsure of your status, please call the Village Hall. Boat stickers will not be issued without one of these documents. Village boat launch (in Sunshine Subdivision) keys may also be purchased at the Village Hall or through the mail. To order by mail, send a check payable to the Village of Third Lake for the appropriate amount, a copy of current state registration, and a list of your watercraft by type and state registration numbers. For your convenience, there is an application form on our website, www.thirdlakevillage.com. Or, visit the Village Hall during office hours. ILLINOIS WATERCRAFT REGISTRATION RENEWAL

As many of you may have noticed, the Illinois Department of Natural Resources has discontinued its registration expiration notification mailings. To renew your Illinois watercraft registration online, go to <https://www.dnr.illinois.gov/boating/Pages/HowToRegister.aspx>.

NON-MOTORIZED WATERCRAFT

Non-motorized watercraft, canoe, kayak, paddle boat, or sail board, in Illinois are no longer required to be titled/registered in Illinois, unless the vessels have a motor or sail. You are now required to purchase a 'Water Usage Stamp' for \$6.00 per calendar year for each of the first three vessels, and \$3.00 each for any additional vessels Please note: an agent fee of \$.50 will be charged per vessel. The stamps are good for one year. They expire on December 31st each year. Your Stamp can be adhered anywhere on the interior or exterior of the vessel as long as it is visible.

Water Usage stamps may be purchased at any location selling Hunting or Fishing licenses. They may not be purchased online or over the phone.
