Back to School Safety Alert

Stopped School Bus.....It's The Law!

- Vehicles must stop when the bus displays flashing lights and extends the stop signal arm. Vehicles may not pass until the flashing red lights and signal are turned off.
- Never pass on the right side of a bus, where children enter or exit.
- Vehicles traveling in the same direction are always required to stop
- Vehicles traveling from the opposite direction are required to stop, except on a divided highway.

Please remind new drivers in your family of the school bus law and to beware of students riding bikes or walking to school, especially in school zones. Students K-5 are difficult to spot when school buses and cars are present.

With the area schools back in session children are walking to their school bus stops in the mornings and walking home after being dropped off in the afternoons. Please be alert and look out for them as you drive through the neighborhoods. After school they are outside playing everywhere. Please watch for them as you are driving through the neighborhoods. SLOW DOWN!

Household Chemical Waste (HCW) Recycling Public Drop-off Collection Events

SWALCO's HCW collection program diverts HCW from the municipal waste stream by sending it to IEPA approved recycling and reuse facilities thereby reducing the volume and toxicity of our municipal waste stream. Our HCW program is a hybrid program consisting of year round public drop-off events (at our Gurnee facility) and mobile collection events (various locations throughout Lake County). This hybrid program is the first of its kind in the State of Illinois providing residents increased accessibility and year round "disposal" opportunities.

Residents have three ways to dispose of their HCW:

The year-round program offers collections twice a month: the second Saturday of every month and the fourth Monday of every month (except December). These events are held at SWALCO's Gurnee facility, located at [1311 N. Estes Street](#). Please use Route 41 to Delany Road (North) to Grove (East) to Estes.

Accepted Items

- All aerosol products (spray paint, hair spray, etc.)
- Motor oil, antifreeze, gas, brake fluid, etc.
- Asbestos containing products
- Batteries: Lithium, NI-CAD, Metal Hydride Batteries (NO ALKALINE)
- Drain cleaners, household cleaners, metal polishes
- Driveway sealers, deck sealers and cleaners, paint removers
- Fertilizer, herbicide, pesticide, insecticide
- Compact fluorescent lamps and tubes
- Solvents: Mineral spirits, kerosene, thinners, sealers
- Mercury (thermometers, thermostats, etc.)
- Oil-based paints, stains, varnishes, sealers
- Pool chemicals
- Personal care products: Cosmetics, shampoos, nail polish, etc.
- Medications: Over-the-counter and prescription (people and pet)

REMINDERS

- ★ **Building Permits** - If you are unsure whether or not your project requires a building permit, please call the Village Hall for confirmation.

Some projects that you may not know need permits include:

- Hot water heater replacement
- Air conditioning unit replacement
- Furnace replacement
- Interior remodeling

- ★ **Overnight Parking** - There is no parking on Village streets between the hours of 2:00 am and 7:00 am. If you need to leave a car on the street overnight, you must call or email the Village Hall by 2:00 am. - ★ **Burning-** Dry leaves, brush, branches under 1 1/2" in diameter, and yard waste may be burned between **April 15 and May 15.**

TREE TRIMMING TO BEGIN SOON

Trees and branches that interfere with power lines can create safety hazards and cause power outages. Preventative tree maintenance helps avoid power outages.

Within the next 3 months, ComEd will trim trees, branches and vines that interfere with power lines.

In some cases, tree removal may be required. The remaining tree stumps are treated with an approved herbicide to prevent future regrowth. Herbicide will be applied by state-licensed applicators.

All work is performed by trained, qualified arborists.

ELECTRONICS RECYCLING

Electronics such as TVs, Computers, monitors, etc. will not be picked up with the trash.

Beginning January 1, 2012, the Illinois Electronic Products Recycling and Reuse Act landfill ban for certain electronic devices became effective. Items such as televisions, monitors, computers and printers are some of the most common items that are no longer allowed in the regular trash. Residents of the County should direct prohibited electronic items to a residential recycling drop off location hosted by SWALCO.

Grayslake has a year round drop off location at the Public Works Facility at 585 Berry Ave.

Hours are Monday - Friday 7 a.m. - 3:30 p.m., Saturday 8 a.m. - 12 p.m.

Cardboard, mixed paper, household containers, shoes, clothing and textiles are also accepted at this location.
