Leaf Burning Season Starts

Nov. 1 - Nov. 30

REMINDERS

- * *Dry leaves, brush, branches under 1 1/2" in diameter, and yard waste may be burned between November 1 and November 30.*
- * *Burning is permitted between the hours of 9 am and 3 pm only.*
- * *Burning is only allowed in a fire-proof barrel or other receptacle that is elevated above ground by at least 6" but no more than 24".*
- * ***Burning is not permitted:***
When wind is in excess of 15 mph;
Within 20' of any building or structure;
Within 25' of any wetland, lake or other body of water, or Lake

County Forest Preserve property;

On Village streets, sidewalks or other public right of way.

- * *Fire must be attended at all times by a person 16 years of age or older.*
- * *Must have a water source and adequate means of delivering water immediately adjacent to the fire.*

Violations of this Village Ordinance No. 09-07-02 will result in fines which will increase each time a violation is committed from \$50.00 to \$750.00. Call the Village with any questions or complaints.

Yard waste stickers are available at the Village Hall for \$1.00 each.

ORDINANCE REMIDERS

Parking Restrictions

Parking is prohibited on Village streets between the hours of 2am and 7am. In the event you have an overnight guest or need to park on the street for driveway maintenance, please call the Village Hall with your name, address, vehicle license plate number and vehicle description prior to parking your vehicle.

Dogs

Dogs must be leashed when off of your property per Village Ordinance.

Also, when taking your dog for a walk please be prepared to clean up after your pet.

LAKES

Dam

The dam on Third Lake will be open (water level down) on or about November 1st, 2011. The Dam will be closed on or about April 1st, 2012.

Piers

In order to avoid damage to your pier, it is recommended that you remove the pier from the lake before the water freezes.

VANDALISM

The Village has had reports of vandalism to signs, mailboxes, eggs thrown at homes, etc. If you should notice anything out of the ordinary (day or night) please call the Lake County Sheriff at 847.377.4000.

MAILBOXES are protected by federal law, and crimes against them and the mail they contain are considered a federal offense. Violators can be fined up to \$250,000 or imprisoned for up to three years for each act of vandalism.

If you have teenagers at home, talk with them about the downside of damaging mailboxes, and vandalism in general. The Postal Service doesn't take these crimes lightly because of the severity of the potential consequences. If you discover someone tampering with your or your neighbor's mailbox, get a description of the person (s), a description and license plate number of any vehicle, then immediately report this information to the sheriff.

The Lake County Health Department / Community Health Center is offering Flu Vaccination Clinics.

Flu Vaccination Clinics Information

The 2011-2012 seasonal flu vaccination contains the novel H1N1 virus strain, so only one type of flu vaccine is needed this year. However, some young children will require two doses of the seasonal vaccine. If a second dose is needed for your child, a nurse will discuss this with you at the flu clinic.

Who should receive a flu vaccination?

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends that all individuals receive a flu vaccination every year. However, people in the following groups should make a special effort to get vaccinated annually against the flu:

- Children 6 months to 18 years of age
- Pregnant females and breastfeeding mothers
- Adults 50 years and older
- People who are very overweight
- Residents of nursing homes and other chronic care facilities
- Adults and Children with **chronic illnesses**

Who should NOT receive a flu vaccination?

Most people are able to get the flu vaccine, however, a few people have issues that make them unable to be vaccinated against the flu. You will be asked several precautionary questions at the time of your visit. The most common reason is a severe allergy to eggs. In addition, a person who is moderately to severely ill with a fever should wait to get their flu vaccination until they are feeling better. How much does it cost?

The cost of the flu vaccine is \$35.00 for adults 19 and older. The cost of the flu vaccine for children 18 years of age or younger is \$15. Children who receive services must be eligible for the Federal **Vaccine for Children**

Immunization Clinics

The Immunization Program will not have any mass flu immunization clinics for 2011. However, flu vaccine is available at the Immunization Program routine immunization clinics. Please call 847-377-8470 for more information or to make an appointment.
