## SHARPS / NEEDLES DISPOSAL

There are currently no regulations for residents disposing of sharps/needles at home. However, the Health Department recommends placing "sharps" (such as needles) in a medical sharps disposal container or in a hard plastic bottle marked "Do Not Recycle," that is capped when full and placed in the garbage for disposal. Bandages/dressings should be put in a plastic bag prior to placing them in the garbage. Additional disposal information can be found at the EPA.

**WATERCRAFT STICKERS/REGISTRATION**

Get your boat stickers and keys starting April 1st. Every watercraft must have **both** a state registration sticker and a Village sticker. In order to purchase a Village sticker, **you must have a valid current state registration on file with the Village.** If you purchase a new boat, a processed application for state registration from the DNR will be accepted for this year. The Village has past years' registrations on file. If you are unsure of your status, please call the Village Hall. Boat stickers will not be issued without one of these documents. Village boat launch (in Sunshine Subdivision) keys may also be purchased at the Village Hall or through the mail. To order by mail, send a check payable to the Village of Third Lake for the appropriate amount, a copy of state registration, and a list of your watercraft by type and state registration numbers. **NEW BOATING ORDINANCE**

There have been important changes to the boating regulations in Illinois and the Village of Third Lake.

**FEES ARE AS FOLLOWS:**

<b>Non-motorized Craft</b>	<b>\$10.00</b>
<b>Craft with Electric Motors</b>	<b>\$15.00</b>
<b><u>Gas Motorized Craft:</u></b>	
<b>10 Horsepower or less</b>	<b>\$25.00</b>
<b>11-25 Horsepower</b>	<b>\$35.00</b>
<b>Over 25 Horsepower</b>	<b>\$45.00</b>
<b>Village Boat Launch Key</b>	<b>\$15.00 (Limit one per household)</b>
<b>Replacement Launch Key</b>	<b>\$50.00</b>

The Village of Third Lake registration and boating rules and regulations ordinance can be picked up at the Village Hall or a PDF copy can be emailed to you if you would like.

One of the major changes to the ordinance is that the operator of any watercraft that is towing a person or persons shall display a bright orange flag measuring not less than 12 inch-

es per side. The flag shall be displayed at the highest point of the area surrounding the boats helm as to be visible from all directions, continuously, while the person or persons being towed depart the boat in preparation for towing and until re-entry into the boat when the activity has ceased. Display of the flag for purposes other than the activity described is prohibited.



**It's the Law!**



All Persons born after January 1, 1998 are required by Illinois State Law to take and pass a boating safety course validated by the Illinois Department of Natural Resources and hold a valid boating safety certificate before they can operate a motorboat with an engine over 10 Horsepower. **THIS INCLUDES PERSONAL WATER CRAFT!**

≈ Persons at least 12 years of age and less than 18 years of age may operate a motorboat with over 10 horsepower only if they are accompanied on the motorboat and under the direct control of a parent or guardian or a person at least 18 years of age designated by a parent or guardian, or the motorboat operator is in possession of a Boating Safety Certificate issued by the Department of Natural Resources, Division of Law enforcement, authorizing the holder to operate motorboats.

When picking up your Village boat stickers this year, you will be given a copy of the new Boating Ordinance.. Rules and Guidelines. **Please share these important documents with your children and visitors as well.**



**BOATING SAFETY EDUCATION**

The Illinois Boating Education Course consists of a minimum of eight hours of instruction. These

courses cover the basics of boating safety, equipment and requirements, navigation, motorboat, registration and titling, emergency measures and the Illinois boating laws.

**NO PERSON UNDER 10 YEARS OF AGE MAY OPERATE A MOTORBOAT. AGE 10 YEARS AND LESS THAN 12 YEARS OF AGE MAY OPERATE UNDER A PARENT OR GUARDIAN'S DIRECT CONTROL.**

The program is primarily designed to train young people between the ages of 12 and 18. The educational material is on a sixth-grade reading level.

**Who MUST take the course?**

All Persons at least 12 years and less than 18 years.

**Two ways to take the course:**

Instructor-led classes. Interested individuals may call 1-800-832-2599.

Online Self-Study Course. Students may study the course material at their own pace, completing chapter reviews along the way. At the end of the course material the student will be required to pass an exam. Student certification mailed by the course provider.

Even if not required by law to get the Illinois boating license, many boaters take the boat safety course in order to save on their PWC or boat insurance.

**You Must Carry the Card**

≈ Vessel operators who are required to have a Boater Education Card must carry the card on board the vessel and have it available for inspection by an enforcement officer.

**REMINDERS**

★ **Building Permits** - If you are unsure whether or not your project requires a building permit, please call the Village Hall for confirmation.

Some projects that you may not know need permits include:

- Hot water heater replacement
- Air conditioning unit replacement
- Furnace replacement
- Interior remodeling

★ **Overnight Parking** - There is no parking on Village streets between the hours of 2:00 am and 7:00 am. If you need to leave a car on the street overnight, you must call or email the Village Hall by 2:00 am. Leave a message including your name, address & the vehicle (s) license plate number (s). **\*\*\* PLEASE DO NOT FORGET TO LEAVE THE LICENSE PLATE NUMBER (S)\*\*\***

★ **Burning**- Dry leaves, brush, branches under 1 1/2" in diameter, and yard waste may be burned between **April 15 and May 15.**
