WATERCRAFT STICKERS/REGISTRATION

Get your boat stickers and keys starting April 1st. Every watercraft must have both a state registration sticker and a Village sticker. In order to purchase a Village sticker, you must have a valid current state registration on file with the Village. If you purchase a new boat, a processed application for state registration from the DNR will be accepted for this year. The Village has past years' registrations on file. If you are unsure of your status, please call the Village Hall. Boat stickers will not be issued without one of these documents. Village boat launch (in Sunshine Subdivision) keys may also be purchased at the Village Hall or through the mail. To order by mail, send a check payable to the Village of Third Lake for the appropriate amount, a copy of state registration, and a list of your watercraft by type and state registration numbers. For your convenience, there is an application form on our website, www.thirdlakevillage.com. Or, visit the Village Hall during office hours. For Mariner's Cove boat launch keys contact the Mariner's Cove Home Owner's Association.

Non-motorized watercraft, canoe, kayak, paddle boat, or sail board, in Illinois are no longer required to be titled/registered in Illinois, unless the vessels have a motor or sail. You are now required to purchase a 'Water Usage Stamp' for \$6.00 per calendar year for each of the first three vessels, and \$3.00 each for any additional vessels. Please note: an agent fee of \$.50 will be charged per vessel. The stamps are good for one year they expire on December 31st each year.

The State does not send out reminders any longer when your state regis-

tration expires. You will need to go to the Illinois Department of Natural Resources website to apply and pay for your new state registration. Please print out a copy and remember to bring it to the Village when coming in for your 2015 Village sticker. If you aren't sure if your registration is current with the Village, please call and ask. Thank you.



LAKE COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT NEWS

Website and Phone App Notify Beachgoers of Swim Bans. Memorial Day traditionally marks the unofficial start of summer. Lake County residents will soon be heading for lakes and beaches. Before you go, make sure you check to see if your favorite beach is open for swimming.

From Memorial Day to Labor Day, daily information is available about local Lake Michigan and inland lake swim bans through the Lake County Health Department/Community Health Center's website by visiting <http://health.lakecountyl.gov/population/LMU/pages/beach-advisory.aspx>. The free phone application is called **mybeachcast** and is available at <http://glin.net/beachcast/>. The app is for beaches in the eight Great Lakes states of Illinois, Indiana, Wisconsin, Michigan, Minnesota, Ohio, Pennsylvania and New York. The phone app not only tells whether the beach is open or closed, but also provides the temperature, humidity, visibility and wind speed at each beach.

In addition to monitoring swimming beaches along Lake Michigan in Lake County, the Health Department also monitors about 90 licensed beaches on inland lakes, including the Chain O'Lakes. Test samples taken from lakes each summer exceed the water quality standards approximately 10 percent of the time. When bacteria levels in the water are high, the Health Department notifies the beach's manager and a sign is posted indicating a swim ban is in place. Since elevat-

ed bacteria levels may result in lake water after a rainfall that washes pollutants into the lake, the Health Department advises residents to avoid swimming after a large rain event.

Most swimming related illnesses typically cause short-term health problems and usually are not reported to or treated by health providers. The most common illness is gastroenteritis, which causes diarrhea, vomiting and stomach pain that typically develop one to two days after exposure. Other illnesses include ear, eye, nose and throat infections. Skin parasites such as ringworm and schistosomiasis (swimmers itch) can be transmitted in areas of water degradation. Although there are many serious illnesses transmitted through water, swimmers are rarely exposed to these more serious diseases in the United States. REMINDERS

★ **Building Permits** - If you are unsure whether or not your project requires a building permit, please call the Village Hall for confirmation.

Some projects that you may not know need permits include:

- Hot water heater replacement
- Air conditioning unit replacement
- Furnace replacement
- Interior remodeling

★ **Overnight Parking** - There is no parking on Village streets between the hours of 2:00 am and 7:00 am. If you need to leave a car on the street overnight, you must call or email the Village Hall by 2:00 am. Leave a message including your name, address & the vehicle (s) license plate number (s). ***** PLEASE DO NOT FORGET TO LEAVE THE LICENSE PLATE NUMBER (S)*****

★ **Burning**- Dry leaves, brush, branches under 1 1/2" in diameter, and yard waste may be burned between **April 15 and May 15.**

ELECTRONICS RECYCLING

Electronics such as Tvs. Computers, monitors, etc. will not be picked up with the trash.

Beginning January 1, 2012, the Illinois Electronic Products Recycling and Reuse Act landfill ban for certain electronic devices became effective. Items such as televisions, monitors, computers and printers are some of the most common items that are no longer allowed in the regular trash. Residents of the County should direct prohibited electronic items to a residential recycling drop off location hosted by SWALCO.

Grayslake has a year round drop off location at the Public Works Facility at 585 Berry Ave. Hours are Monday - Friday 7 a.m. - 3:30 p.m., Saturday 8 a.m. - 12 p.m.

Cardboard, mixed paper, household containers, shoes, clothing and textiles are also accepted at this location.
