& SWIMMERS!!!!



SWIMMERS:

PLEASE USE CAUTION WHEN SWIMMING IN THE LAKES. DO NOT SWIM BEYOND THE 150' ZONE IN THIRD LAKE WHICH IS MARKED BY BUOYS. KEEP AN EYE ON YOUR CHILDREN TO BE SURE THEY DO NOT GO BEYOND THE BUOYS.

SWIMMING AT DUSK OR IN THE DARK IS ESPECIALLY DANGEROUS. BOATERS DO NOT EXPECT PEOPLE TO BE SWIMMING OUTSIDE OF THE 150' NO WAKE ZONE AND CANNOT SEE SWIMMERS IN THE DARK.

IF YOU HAVE A WATER TRAMPOLINE, BE SURE IT IS PLACED WITHIN THE 150' ZONE AS WELL.

BOATERS:

PLEASE OBSERVE THE 150' NO WAKE AREA. THIS INCLUDES, ALL BOATS, PERSONAL WATERCRAFTS, AND SKIERS. THE SKIERS CANNOT DRIFT INTO THE 150' ZONE EVEN IF THE BOAT IS BEYOND THE ZONE.

IF YOU ARE USING A JET SKI OR PERSONAL WATERCRAFT YOU MUST FOLLOW ALL OF THE SAME LAWS AND SAFETY GUIDELINES AS BOATS.

PLEASE DO YOUR PART TO KEEP ALL BOATERS AND SWIMMERS SAFE.

Illinois Special Election for U.S. Senate Seat By Lake County Government

Illinois voters will see the U.S. Senate race on their ballot twice this fall; and it will not be a mistake. The U.S. District Court of the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division issued an order requiring a special election as part of the regular November 2010 ballot. The special election is to fill the U.S. Senate vacancy created by the resignation of Barack Obama in November 2008.

Pending the November election, U.S. Senator Roland Burris will continue to serve as the appointed Senator filling the vacancy created by Obama's election as President. The special election results will be final once the Illinois State Board of Elections certifies the election results. The State Board of Elections expects to canvass the special election sometime in late November. The candidate who wins the race for the unexpired term will serve from late November through January 2, 2011.

The full term U.S. Senate contest will be listed on the November ballot first, before the special election contest. The candidate elected to the full term will serve from January 3, 2011 through January 2017.

Samples Show West Nile Virus in Lake County

Five mosquito pools in southeast Lake County have tested positive for West Nile virus (WNV). The samples are the first confirmed indicators of the disease's presence in Lake County in 2010. WNV is a potentially dangerous infection transmitted to humans through the bite of an infected mosquito. No human cases have been reported in Illinois in 2010. It's important to take precautions to avoid mosquito bites including using insect repellent containing DEET. The Health Department maintains a West Nile virus hotline for county residents to report areas of stagnant water (which are conducive for mosquito breeding), or to obtain more information on the signs and symptoms of West Nile encephalitis. ComEd Offers Cool Tips on How to Combat Heat and Lower Electricity Bills

- Keep thermostats at a constant, comfortable level (75-78 degrees) when at home. Lowering the thermostat setting below the desired temperature will not cool the home faster.
- To reduce heat and moisture during the warmest part of the day, run appliances such as ovens, washing machines, dryers and dishwashers in the early morning or evening hours when it is generally cooler outside. Use a microwave to cook or barbecue outside if possible.
- Use fans to evenly distribute cool air and reduce the air conditioners on time.
- Place window air conditioners on the north or shady side of the house to avoid overworking the unit in the hot daytime sun.
