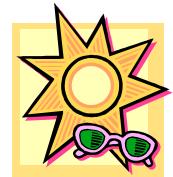

Reminders

- ★ **Fertilizer-** As part of the Village's effort to go "Green", the Village has adopted an ordinance banning the use of fertilizer containing phosphorus. Check out the **Lake County Health Department's Lakes Management website** for information regarding phosphorus including a list of area retailers who sell phosphorus free fertilizers.

- ★ **Clear Paths** - As a courtesy to Village residents and guests, property owners are required to trim trees and shrubs that extend into the sidewalks and streets. People should be able to walk on the sidewalks with out bumping into them.
- ★ **Overnight Parking** - There is no parking on Village streets between the hours of 2:00am and 7:00pm. If you need to leave a car on the street overnight you must call the Village Hall by 2:00am. Leave a message including your name, address, the vehicle (s) license plate number (s).
- ★ **Third Lake, not Grayslake** - Although The Village of Third Lake shares the same zip code as Grayslake, if you live in Mariner's Cove Subdivision or Sunshine Subdivision, you are a resident of Third Lake. There seems to be some confusion with some of the residents regarding what village they live in. You may want to hang a copy of the Village Vine on your fridge as a reminder. The Vine includes many useful phone numbers.

- ★ **Pets and Pet Waste** - Pets are not permitted to roam the Village freely. All pets are required to be leashed when not on the owner's property. Allowing your dog to deposit waste on another resident's property and not picking up the waste is a violation of Village Ordinance.

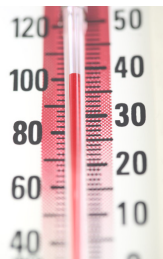

Avon Township Bus Service

Avon Township operates a bus service for the residents of Avon Township. This is a curb-to-curb service that will take passengers within 20 miles of the township building. The bus operates Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. until 2 p.m. The fare is \$1.00 each way and appointments are scheduled on a first come first served basis. If you require the bus to take you to a doctor's visit or other medical/dental need, you may call up to two weeks in advance of the appointment to schedule your ride. All other needs (library, shopping, visits etc) can be scheduled up to a week in advance. There is no need to register for this service. When everyone works together, we can make the best use of our planet's natural resources. When you recycle the products you use every day, like cardboard boxes, milk jugs, and soda cans, you give new life to items that used to be thrown away, saving energy and helping lower greenhouse gas emissions in the process.

Waste Management offers a variety of convenient solutions for recycling items that don't belong in the trash. These include curbside pickup, return-by-mail kits, and more than 30 drop-off locations to make recycling easy for their customers.

Village Receives \$\$ From SWALCO

Are you aware that the Village receives money back for recycling? The Village is reimbursed by the Solid Waste Agency of Lake County (SWALCO) per ton of recyclable commodities. This money helps to offset the \$1.00 per household per year Operations & Maintenance fee charged to the Village by SWALCO. Every little bit helps!! This quarter the Village received a rebate of \$24.00 per ton of recyclable commodities (\$752.64). So please remember to place all recyclables in your recycling container. If you can't fit it cardboard inside, it can be placed on top of the recycling container.

ANYTHING THAT IS NOT IN OR ON TOP OF THE RECYCLING CONTAINER WILL BE PICKED UP AS REGULAR TRASH.

Did You Know??

- "No Wake" means speed at which a vessel does not produce a wake, not to exceed 5 miles per hour.
- It is a violation of state law to exceed "slow, no wake" speed in any areas marked with buoys or signs as "No Wake"
- In Third Lake, there is a "No Wake" area from the shoreline to 150' into the lake. There are several reasons for this rule, including protection of swimmers and helping to prevent erosion to our shoreline.
- It is considered reckless and illegal to jump the wake of another vessel unreasonably close or when visibility around the other vessel is obstructed.
- Persons under the age of 10 may not operate ANY motorized vessel, including personal watercraft.

Buoys

The Buoys have all been set at 150'. If you see anyone moving them please contact the Village.

Boat Launch Ramps

The Mariner's Cove boat launch is being damaged by boaters who have been powering up their boats to load the boats onto trailers.

It is a violation of state law to operate a vessel within 150 feet of a launching ramp at greater than "No Wake" speed.

Simple steps residents can take to prevent water illness – Lake County Health Department

The Lake County Health Department tips for healthy swimming behaviors and recreational water illness prevention Healthy swimming behaviors include:

- ★ Don't swim when you have diarrhea. You can spread germs in the water and make other people sick.
- ★ Don't swallow the pool or lake water. In fact, avoid getting water in your mouth.
- ★ Practice good hygiene. Shower before swimming and wash your hands after using the toilet or changing diapers. Germs on your body end up in the water.
- ★ Take children on bathroom breaks or change diapers often. Waiting to hear "I have to go" may mean that it's too late.
- ★ Change diapers in a bathroom and not at poolside. Germs can spread to surfaces and objects in and around the pool and spread illness.
- ★ Wash your child thoroughly (especially the rear end) with soap and water before swimming. People commonly have minute amounts of fecal matter on their skin that end up in the pool.
- ★ All children who are not toilet-trained should wear tight-fitting rubber or plastic pants.

Recreational water illnesses (RWIs) are spread by swimming in water contaminated as a result of poorly maintained recreational water venues, the presence of chlorine-resistant germs, or runoff-related contamination of lake beaches. The public's awareness of RWIs and appropriate swimming behaviors play a pivotal role in RWI transmission. Swimmers who are ill with diarrhea may contaminate swimming venues. This poses health risks for the healthy swimmers in the pool or lake.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, in the past two decades, there has been a substantial increase in the number of RWI outbreaks associated with swimming. Cases in the U.S. of one pathogen, *Cryptosporidium*, increased 200 percent from 2004 – 2008.

The Health Department monitors the beaches on Lake Michigan as well as many of the beaches on inland lakes in the county, and coordinates with beach operators on when swim bans should occur. Health Department staff also inspects and responds to citizen concerns for all public swimming pools in Lake County.
