Third Lake Fishes on Display at the Shedd Aquarium

In October, Jim Bland (a Third Lake resident), Dr. Phil Willink, and Eve Barrs from the Shedd Aquarium did seining along the Third Lake shoreline for purposes of collecting fish for display at the Aquarium. The Aquarium has an exhibit entitled *At Home with Fishes of the Great Lakes*. Aquarium staff were looking specifically for some perch to put on display. They lucked out on their first seine haul, catching over ten perch of two different year classes. The perch weren't eating size but in future years there may be a nice adult perch fishery in the lake. Other fish caught that day included: bluntnose minnows, blackstripe topminnows, Iowa darters, johnny darters and bluegills. The Iowa darter was put back into Third Lake since it is an endangered and threatened fish in Illinois. Collected fish are first put into quarantine for 6 weeks to screen for parasites and diseases before they are ready to be put on display. Pictures of the darters and minnows can be seen on the internet. Those good looking Third Lake perch as well as the other species should be on display at the Shedd by December.



Crisis Care Program (CCP)

What is CCP?

CCP provides a variety of services to individuals facing a crisis. A mental health crisis could include overwhelming depression, thoughts of suicide, poor concentration, disturbing thoughts, or feeling out of control. Sometimes people find themselves crying a lot, feeling anxious, or having trouble thinking clearly. When these problems come on suddenly, or take a noticeable turn for the worse, and interfere with a person's ability to deal with every day life, this can be considered a crisis. Sometimes just talking to a caring professional can make a difference. We can help people understand what's going on, help them explore their options, offer support, and suggest other resources that might provide further assistance. We especially want to help people avoid psychiatric hospitalization or re-hospitalization when possible.

Crisis Phone Counseling

Crisis Counselors are available 24 hours a day to speak with you by phone. You do not have to give your name when you call. We can help guide you through difficult times, manage stress, anxiety and depression, and cope with longer-term difficulties. Information and referrals to other Health Department programs are also available. **Crisis Counseling at Our Office**

Crisis Counselors are also available to speak with you in person 24 hours a day. You can call first to let us know you're coming by, or just show up.

People frequently come to see us in person when they don't feel comfortable talking by phone, or when they just like to see somebody face-to-face to talk about what's bothering them.

Respite

Respite is a service where people in crisis come and stay at our program. Most people stay 1-2 weeks, but some people stay a little longer, and some a little less.

While here, you will attend daily groups to help you find more effective ways to cope with your symptoms or situation, and recover from your crisis. You will be seen by our psychiatrist, and treated with medication if appropriate.

To be admitted, you must be a Lake County resident, age 18 or over, and be experiencing a mental health crisis.

Who is eligible?

Services are available to Lake County residents, at least 18 years of age.

What is the cost?

Fees are based on level of income and number of dependents. A sliding fee schedule based on national poverty levels is available for Lake County residents.

Hours of service and location

Walk-ins are welcomed at the program office: 3002 Grand Avenue in Waukegan. Call or come by to learn more. Crisis Intervention services are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. **Contact Information**

REMINDERS

- ★ **Inoperable Vehicles** - It is a violation of the Village Ordinance to park or store a vehicle which is inoperable or unlicensed in residential driveways.
- ★ **Clear Paths** - As a courtesy to Village residents and guests, property owners are required to trim trees and shrubs that extend into the sidewalks and streets. People should be able to walk on the sidewalks without bumping into them.
- ★ **Building Permits** - If you are unsure whether or not your project requires a building permit, please call the Village Hall for confirmation.
Some projects that you may not know need permits include:
 - Hot water heater replacement
 - Air conditioning unit replacement
 - Furnace replacement
 - Interior remodeling
- ★ **Overnight Parking** - There is no parking on Village streets between the hours of 2:00 am and 7:00 am. If you need to leave a car on the street overnight, you must call or email the Village Hall by 2:00 am. Leave a message including your name, address & the vehicle (s) license plate number (s). ***** PLEASE DO NOT FORGET TO LEAVE THE LICENSE PLATE NUMBER (S)*****
- ★ **Pets and Pet Waste** - Pets are not permitted to roam the Village freely. All pets are required to be leashed when not on the owner's property. Allowing your dog to deposit waste on another resident's property or on Village sidewalks or streets and not picking up the waste is a violation of our Village Ordinance.
- ★ **Burning** - Dry leaves, brush, branches under 1 1/2" in diameter, and yard waste may be burned between November 1 and November 30.
 - * **Burning is permitted between the hours of 9 am and 3 pm only.**
 - * **Burning is only allowed in a fireproof barrel or other receptacle that is elevated above ground by at least 6" but no more than 24".**
 - * **Burning is not permitted:**
 - When wind is in excess of 15 mph;**
 - Within 20' of any building or structure;**
 - Within 25' of any wetland, lake or other body of water, or Lake County Forest Preserve property;**
 - On Village streets, sidewalks or other public right of way.**
 - * **Fire must be attended at all times by a person 16 years of age or older.**
 - * **Must have a water source and adequate means of delivering water immediately adjacent to the fire.**

Violations of this Village Ordinance will result in fines which will increase each time a violation is committed from \$50.00 to \$750.00. Call the Village with any questions or complaints.
