SNOW EVENT ENFORCEMENT

The snow event of December 26 was a trying experience for everyone. It was especially trying for the Village snow plowing service. Upon entering Mariner's Cove Subdivision they were met with cars parked on both sides of the street, cars parked on the street in front of empty driveways and residents blowing/plowing the snow from their driveways back into the street. This behavior is not acceptable.



Village Ordinance No. 11-08-05 states that there is no parking of any vehicle on Village streets at any time within 12 hours after a snowfall of ONE INCH or more has occurred.

Village Ordinance No. 10-06-02 states that it is unlawful to interfere with, obstruct or tend to obstruct or render dangerous for passage any street.

Effective immediately, these ordinances will be

vigorously enforced. Violations will result in the issuance of a \$25.00 fine.

Calling in a vehicle left on the road overnight during / after a snowfall of one inch or more will not excuse you from receiving a violation and parking ticket.

Due to the nature of the street layout in Mariner's Cove, the plowing service may unintentionally hit a mailbox or scrape a section of sod near the curb. If this happens, please report the incident to The Village President, Gary Beggan at 847.223.8422 during normal business hours or at gbeggan@sbcglobal.net or 847.223.5105 when the Village Hall is closed. Leave your name, street address and a contact method to facilitate follow-up action. He checks his email and telephone messages periodically throughout the day.

Please remember to shovel around your fire hydrant also.

REMINDERS

- ★ **Inoperable Vehicles** - It is a violation of the Village Ordinance to park or store a vehicle which is inoperable or unlicensed in residential driveways.
- ★ **Clear Paths** - As a courtesy to Village residents and guests, property owners are required to trim trees and shrubs that extend into the sidewalks and streets. People should be able to walk on the sidewalks without bumping into them.
- ★ **Building Permits** - If you are unsure whether or not your project requires a building permit, please call the Village Hall for confirmation.
Some projects that you may not know require permits include:
 - Hot water heater replacement
 - Air conditioning unit replacement
 - Furnace replacement
 - Interior remodeling
- ★ **Overnight Parking** - There is no parking on Village streets between the hours of 2:00 am and 7:00 am. If you need to leave a car on the street overnight, you must call or email the Village Hall by 2:00 am. Leave a message including your name, address & the vehicle (s) license plate number (s). ***** PLEASE DO NOT FORGET TO LEAVE THE LICENSE PLATE NUMBER (S)*****
- ★ **Parking on Village Streets is prohibited within 12 Hours after a snowfall of one inch or more**
- ★ **Pets and Pet Waste** - Pets are not permitted to roam the Village freely. All pets are required to be leashed when not on the owner's property. Allowing your dog to deposit waste on another resident's property or on Village sidewalks or streets and not picking up the waste is a violation of our Village Ordinance.

WARNING>>>ICE DANGER ON THIRD LAKE

This Year, because of the way the lake has frozen, there is an air gap between the ice and the lake water, making the ice more dangerous to walk on, skate on, drive on, etc. Please use extra caution if you choose to use the lake ice for outdoor activities.

Radon Gas Testing Kits Available through the Health Department

January is National Radon Action Month

Now is an ideal time to have your home tested for radon. Short term test kits are available at the Health Department for \$10.00.

January has been designated National Radon Action Month by the Environmental Protection Agency. In connection with this observance, the Lake County Health Department/Community Health Center is encouraging residents to check the radon levels of their homes or apartments in January or during the winter months.

“The best time to check for radon is during cold weather when windows and doors remain closed,” said Tony Beltran, the Health Department’s Executive Director. “Radon increases your risk of lung cancer, so it is important to check the level in your home.”

Short-term test kits are available through the Health Department for \$10.00. The cost includes return postage, laboratory analysis and interpretation by Health Department staff. Test kits are also available from area hardware and building supply stores.

Radon, an odorless and colorless gas naturally found in rock and soil, seeps into homes from the soil through cracks in the basement floor and foundation, crawl spaces, poorly sealed sump pumps, floor drains, porous cinder block walls and other foundation floor and wall penetrations. Although radon gas is measurable everywhere, the highest readings are normally found in the basement and first floor levels of homes and apartments.

“If radon is found in your home, it is important to contact a radon professional to assess and prevent the radon gas from entering your home,” said Beltran. For additional information, contact the Health Department’s Ecological Services at: (847) 377-8020.
