Listed below are a few of the available residential electronics recycling locations within Lake County. This program is free to Lake County residents and appointments are not required. The locations and hours of operation are set by the host of the collection site and any questions regarding their procedures should be made to them. These collections are open only on the specified dates and residents will be politely turned away if visiting at an un-scheduled time.

Fire Prevention Week is October 9 - 15, 2016

Get ahead of the winter freeze. Its not too early to begin preparing for the heating season. Check these ten tips off your list and get ahead of the winter freeze.

1. Have your furnace inspected and serviced by a qualified professional a least once a year.
2. Have your chimney and vents cleaned and inspected by a qualified professional. Not cleaning your chimney is the leading cause of chimney fires from built up creosote. This service needs to be done at least once a year.
3. Make sure wood for fireplace or wood stove is dry, seasoned wood.
4. Make sure your fireplace screen is metal or heat-tempered glass, in good condition and secure in its position in front of the fireplace.
5. Have a covered metal container ready to use to dispose of cooled ashes. The ash container should be stored at least 10 feet from the home and any nearby buildings.
6. Remind children to stay at least 3 feet away from fireplace, wood/ pellet stove, oil stove or other space heaters.
7. Make sure portable space heaters have an automatic shut-off.
8. Make sure portable space heaters are plugged directly into an outlet (not an extension cord) and placed at least 3 feet from anything that can burn; like bedding, paper, walls, and even people.
9. Test smoke alarms and make sure they are working. You need smoke alarms on every level of your home, inside each sleeping room and outside each sleeping area. For the best protection, the smoke alarms should be interconnected so when one sounds, they all sound.
10. Be sure to test carbon monoxide alarms and make sure they are working. Carbon monoxide alarms should be located outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home.

REMINDERS

- ★ **Inoperable Vehicles** - It is a violation of the Village Ordinance to park or store a vehicle which is inoperable or unlicensed in residential driveways.
- ★ **Clear Paths** - As a courtesy to Village residents and guests, property owners are required to trim trees and shrubs that extend into the sidewalks and streets. People should be able to walk on the sidewalks without bumping into them.
- ★ **Building Permits** - If you are unsure whether or not your project requires a building permit, please call the Village Hall for confirmation.
Some projects that you may not know need permits include:
 - Hot water heater replacement
 - Air conditioning unit replacement
 - Furnace replacement
 - Interior remodeling
- ★ **Overnight Parking** - There is no parking on Village streets between the hours of 2:00 am and 7:00 am. If you need to leave a car on the street overnight, you must call or email the Village Hall by 2:00 am. Leave a message including your name, address & the vehicle (s) license plate number (s). *** **PLEASE DO NOT FORGET TO LEAVE THE LICENSE PLATE NUMBER (S)*****
- ★ **Pets and Pet Waste** - Pets are not permitted to roam the Village freely. All pets are required to be leashed when not on the owner's property. Allowing your dog to deposit waste on another resident's property or on Village sidewalks or streets and not picking up the waste is a violation of our Village Ordinance.
- ★ **Burning** - Dry leaves, brush, branches under 1 1/2" in diameter, and yard waste may be burned between November 1 and November 30.
 - * **Burning is permitted between the hours of 9 am and 3 pm only.**
 - * **Burning is only allowed in a fireproof barrel or other receptacle that is elevated above ground by at least 6" but no more than 24".**
 - * **Burning is not permitted:**
 - When wind is in excess of 15 mph;**
 - Within 20' of any building or structure;**
 - Within 25' of any wetland, lake or other body of water, or Lake County Forest Preserve property;**
 - On Village streets, sidewalks or other public right of way.**
 - * **Fire must be attended at all times by a person 16 years of age or older.**
 - * **Must have a water source and adequate means of delivering water immediately adjacent to the fire.**

Violations of this Village Ordinance will result in fines which will increase each time a violation is committed from \$50.00 to \$750.00. Call the Village with any questions or complaints.

Trash & Yard Waste - Waste Management Guidelines:

All waste materials must be placed out at the curb for collection by 6:00am the day of your collection, but not before 5:00pm the day before your pick-up. **This includes yard waste bags and containers.**

All containers and any solid waste materials that are not collected must be removed from the curb by 8:00am the day after your scheduled collection.
