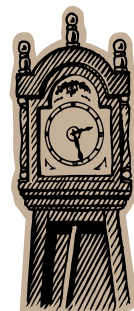

The Waste Management refuse and recycling collection rates for 2015-2016 will be adjusted as follows effective November 1, 2015:

- > **Single Family** **\$16.93 per household per month**
- > **Single Family with cart** **\$18.90 per household per month**
- > **Senior** **\$14.59 per household per month**
- > **Senior with cart** **\$16.23 per household per month**
- > **Landscape** **\$95.63 per household per season**

Trash & Yard Waste - Waste Management Guidelines:

All waste materials must be placed out at the curb for collection by 6:00am the day of your collection, but not before 5:00pm the day before your pick-up. **This includes yard waste bags and containers.**

All containers and any solid waste materials that are not collected must be removed from the curb by 8:00am the day after your scheduled collection.



All containers must be stored out of public view behind an enclosure.

INOPERABLE VEHICLES...It is a violation of the Village Ordinance to park a vehicle which is inoperable or unlicensed in residential driveways.



BOATS VS. SWIMMERS!!!

Please be aware and inform your guests that is not safe to swim outside the boundaries of the buoys unless accompanied by a boat. Make sure to wear something that will make you more visible to boaters and personal watercraft users.

Some of our residents enjoy swimming across the lake. Please watch out for them. There have been reports of “near misses” by boats almost hitting swimmers. Please be observant of your surroundings in the lake whether boating or swimming. It is very difficult for boat drivers to see swimmers.

DAM OPENING - NOVEMBER 1

The dam will be opening on or about November 1. When the dam is open the water level will drop.

Please have your boats out of the water.

PIERS...In order to avoid damage to your pier, it is strongly recommended that you remove your pier from the lake before the water freezes.

REMINDERS

- ★ **Fertilizer** - As part of the Village’s effort to go “Green”, the Village has adopted an ordinance banning the use of fertilizer containing phosphorus.
- ★ **Clear Paths** - As a courtesy to Village residents and guests, property owners are required to trim trees and shrubs that extend into the sidewalks and streets. People should be able to walk on the sidewalks without bumping into them.
- ★ **Building Permits** - If you are unsure whether or not your project requires a building permit, please call the Village Hall for confirmation. Some projects that you may not know need permits include:
 - Hot water heater replacement
 - Air conditioning unit replacement
 - Furnace replacement
 - Interior remodeling
- ★ **Overnight Parking** - There is no parking on Village streets between the hours of 2:00 am and 7:00 am. If you need to leave a car on the street overnight, you must call or email the Village Hall by 2:00 am. Leave a message including your name, address & the vehicle (s) license plate number (s). ***** PLEASE DO NOT FORGET TO LEAVE THE LICENSE PLATE NUMBER (S)*****
- ★ **Pets and Pet Waste** - Pets are not permitted to roam the Village freely. All pets are required to be leashed when not on the owner’s property. Allowing your dog to deposit waste on another resident’s property or on Village sidewalks or streets and not picking up the waste is a violation of our Village Ordinance.
- ★ **Burning** - Dry leaves, brush, branches under 1 1/2” in diameter, and yard waste may be burned between November 1 and November 30.
 - * **Burning is permitted between the hours of 9 am and 3 pm only.**
 - * **Burning is only allowed in a fireproof barrel or other receptacle that is elevated above ground by at least 6” but no more than 24”.**
 - * **Burning is not permitted:**
 - When wind is in excess of 15 mph;**
 - Within 20’ of any building or structure;**
 - Within 25’ of any wetland, lake or other body of water, or Lake County Forest Preserve property;**
 - On Village streets, sidewalks or other public right of way.**
 - * **Fire must be attended at all times by a person 16 years of age or older.**
 - * **Must have a water source and adequate means of delivering water immediately adjacent to the fire.**

Violations of this Village Ordinance will result in fines which will increase each time a violation is committed from \$50.00 to \$750.00. Call the Village with any questions or complaints.
