WARNING TO BOATERS

& SWIMMERS!!!!



SWIMMERS:

PLEASE USE CAUTION WHEN SWIMMING IN THE LAKES. DO NOT SWIM BEYOND THE 150' ZONE IN THIRD LAKE WHICH IS MARKED BY BUOYS. KEEP AN EYE ON YOUR CHILDREN TO BE SURE THEY DO NOT GO BEYOND THE BUOYS.

SWIMMING AT DUSK OR IN THE DARK IS ESPECIALLY DANGEROUS. BOATERS DO NOT EXPECT PEOPLE TO BE SWIMMING OUTSIDE OF THE 150' NO WAKE ZONE AND CANNOT SEE SWIMMERS IN THE DARK.

IF YOU HAVE A WATER TRAMPOLINE, BE SURE IT IS PLACED WITHIN THE 150' ZONE AS WELL.

BOATERS:

PLEASE OBSERVE THE 150' NO WAKE AREA. THIS INCLUDES, ALL BOATS, PERSONAL WATERCRAFTS, AND SKIERS. THE SKIERS CANNOT DRIFT INTO THE 150' ZONE EVEN IF THE BOAT IS BEYOND THE ZONE.

IF YOU ARE USING A JET SKI OR PERSONAL WATERCRAFT YOU MUST FOLLOW ALL OF THE SAME LAWS AND SAFETY GUIDELINES AS BOATS.

PLEASE DO YOUR PART TO KEEP ALL BOATERS AND SWIMMERS SAFE.

Health Department Offers Low-cost Pet Vaccination Clinic - August 21

The Lake County Health Department/Community Health Center's Animal Care and Control Program, together with Zion Animal Control, will offer a low-cost pet vaccination clinic on Saturday, August 21, from 9 a.m. until noon. The clinic will be held at the Zion Park District, Bethel Blvd and 27th Street, in Zion.

This clinic provides a convenient and affordable way for Lake County residents to keep their pets up to date with their shots and rabies tags. Donations of pet food, litter and supplies will also be accepted to benefit The Pooch Pantry, a pet food and supply source for needy families.

Pets will be taken on a first come first served basis. All animals brought to the clinic must be at least four months old. Dogs must be leashed and cats placed in carriers. Only cash will be accepted on site.

The Kids 1st Health Fair will help Lake County kids get ready for school.

Date: Wednesday, August 4

Time: 9 a.m. - 7 p.m.

Location: Miguel Juarez Middle School, 201 N. Butrick, Waukegan

The Fair is free for Lake County families who meet specific income guidelines. For example, a family of four with a gross income limit of \$40,792 would qualify for services. Children in grades K-9 will receive physical and dental exams, immunizations and blood work required for school. Required services include dental screenings for children in preschool, kindergarten, 2nd and 6th grades, and physicals for children in Head Start, kindergarten, 6th and 9th grades.
