8. Discussion regarding Lakes Committee function and responsibilities

- President Buckley stated that he met with Lake County last week regarding plans for extending the east west bike paths along Washington. He said that there are concerns on the north side of Washington at Mainsail where the cemetery is located and at the sidewalk along the retaining wall since there is not enough space at these locations for the path to be identified as a bike path. He said that the concern on the south side is that the path would have to go through two gas stations, which is not ideal due to the amount of vehicular traffic. He explained that this project is still being investigated and Lake County will be conducting a public forum on the internet. He said that the project will be started in 2024

and the Village will be expected to pay 20% of the sidewalk portions and will be responsible for maintenance once the project is complete. He explained that the current estimated cost to the Village will be \$60,000.
