### Mariner's Cove

The next phase of our Mariner's Cove Retention Ponds Shoreline Restoration Project is scheduled to begin in July and continue for 3-6 weeks, weather dependent. The scope of the stabilization project includes two retention ponds in the Mariner's Cove Subdivision. The project includes installation of rip rap and native planting to stabilize the shore and protect from erosion.

The Mariner's Cove Retention Ponds Shoreline Restoration Project will improve water quality of the retention ponds which flow into Druce Lake/Third Lake.

The project is being funded by the Mariner's Cove Homeowner Association and a grant from the Lake County Stormwater Management Commission.

Please use extra caution in driving through Mariner's Cove during this period.

## EXTREME WEATHER BE PREPARED

Springtime in Illinois can be unpredictable and extreme weather events can happen anytime. Being prepared is key and knowing the terms used to describe tornado threats can help keep you safe.

**Tornado Watch:** This means tornadoes are possible near your area.

**Tornado Warning:** This means a tornado has been sighted by someone or indicated by weather radar.

**Tornado Emergency:** This means there is a severe threat to human life and catastrophic damage is expected.

### How to be Prepared For All Kinds of Weather

- Purchase a weather alert radio with a battery backup.
- Determine the safest location in your home. Basements or alternate areas like closets, small interior hallways and bathrooms without windows are the best.
- Have a plan and conduct periodic tornado safety drills.
- Use pillows, mattresses or cushions to protect yourself.
- Get under a piece of sturdy furniture.

## TICK SEASON

Lyme disease is the most common vector-borne illness in the United States. Below are tips how to avoid tickborne illnesses and have a healthy time outdoors:

- Avoid wooded, brushy areas with high grass
- Wear light-colored clothing to find ticks easier
- Tuck long pants into socks and boots
- Apply insect repellent containing 20% DEET, picaridin, R3535, or Oil of Lemon Eucalyptus
- Treat clothing and gear with products containing 0.5% permethrin
- Conduct full-body tick checks on family members (underarms, ears, belly button, behind knees, between legs, waist, hair and scalp) every two to three hours. Also check any gear or pets taken on outings
- Put your clothes in the dryer on high for 10 minutes (or one hour for damp clothes) to kill ticks
- Shower within two hours after coming indoors

## SOLICITORS

Now that nicer weather is here, you may see more solicitors in the neighborhood selling everything from magazines, pest control products or a new roof. While some solicitors work for a legitimate business, there are some that are scammers. Don't be a victim!

The Village's Solicitation Ordinance prohibits selling items or services door-to-door (with the exception of charitable organizations) without acquiring a permit from the Village. A permit is required in order to run a background check on each individual who will be soliciting in the neighborhood. The permit is in the form of a badge and will contain the village logo, a signature from village staff and a picture of the solicitor. The village will also inform residents on the website and social media when a permit is issued. In addition, soliciting is prohibited after 6:00 p.m. Residents can also place a no soliciting sign near the front door.
